In March 2007 he was sponsored by the College to visit and liaise with the National Board of Medical Examiners in Philadelphia, USA on item development and assessment of test validity.

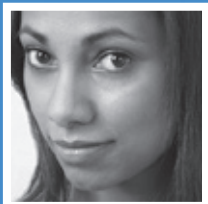
He is a founding member of the new RCOG Assessment Committee.
